



Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

Uniform Policy & Compliance

To protect the integrity, branding, and professionalism of the Elbert County Wranglers organization, this policy establishes uniform standards and approval procedures for all teams.

The Wranglers brand represents our county, our values, and our commitment to unity, discipline, and pride.

Official Uniform Requirement

All Wranglers teams must wear only the official uniforms approved by the Elbert County Wranglers organization.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- Game jerseys
- Game pants
- Hats
- Warm-ups or outerwear worn during official team events
- Helmets and branded equipment used during Wranglers games, tournaments, or events must comply with organizational branding standards. Approved decals, stickers, only.

No substitutions are permitted without Board approval.

Prohibited Modifications

Teams, coaches, parents, or players may not:

- Alter uniform colors
- Add or remove logos
- Change fonts, numbers, or design elements
- Add personal sponsor logos
- Modify sleeve patches or branding
- Replace approved hats with alternative designs
- Create unofficial alternate jerseys
- Embroider, screen print, or heat press additions

Uniforms must remain exactly as issued. **Any additions must be board approved.



Approved Team Accessories (Limited Modifications)

The following items may be worn without Board approval:

- Socks
- Hair bows or headbands
- Belts (if not issued)

However, the following standards apply:

- Accessories must be worn as a **team** — not individually chosen.
- Any modifications must be approved by the Wranglers Board.
- If a team chooses to wear an accessory after board approved, all rostered players must wear it consistently for games to promote unity.***

Customization & Alternate Uniform Requests

If a team wishes to request:

- An alternate jersey
- Special tournament uniform
- Memorial or event patch
- Additional sponsor placement
- Design modification

The following process must be followed:

1. A formal written proposal must be submitted to the Wrangler Board.
2. The proposal must include mockups, vendor information, and cost breakdown.
3. Majority Board approval is required before any order is placed.
4. No orders may be submitted prior to written approval.

Failure to follow this procedure may result in financial responsibility assigned to the ordering party.

Brand Integrity & Code of the West

The Wranglers name, logo, colors, and uniform are more than apparel — they represent who we are and how we represent Elbert County.

Uniform consistency is not about restriction — it is about unity. Uniform compliance is mandatory. Consistency in appearance demonstrates unity, respect for the organization, and accountability to teammates, sponsors, and the community we represent. The Wranglers identity will remain consistent across all teams, age groups, and seasons.

When we step onto the field, court or mat, we do so as one organization.



Policy Enforcement

Compliance with the Wranglers Uniform Policy is mandatory for all athletes, coaches, and teams.

Failure or refusal to comply with this policy will be reviewed by the Wranglers Board and may result in disciplinary action at the Board's discretion. Consequences may include, but are not limited to, suspension from games or other team activities until the uniform or equipment is brought into compliance.

Repeated or intentional violations may result in additional disciplinary action as determined appropriate by the Board.

The goal of enforcement is not punishment, but to ensure that the same standards are applied consistently and fairly across all Wranglers teams and athletes.
